Some of the planned updates include a better structure for the Architecture Review Committee (ARC) to regulate exterior home improvements to uphold the integrity and continuity of our community. The changes to our deed restrictions will require a vote by the homeowners, and we hope you will see the value in our ideas and vote in favor. These changes are being talked about every month at our LHO Board meetings. We would love for you to attend and give your input. 2. Suggested Color Selections

Our Board has been developing a suggested color palette for exterior home painting. This will allow the Architectural Review Committee and the Board to enforce a standard for our neighborhood and be consistent in approval and enforcement. You will be able to find this on the Sherwin Williams Homeowners' Color Archive (QR code at right).



There are suggested palettes with base colors, trim colors and accent colors. You can match these colors at any paint store using these palettes if you do not choose Sherwin Williams paint. A Request Form must be filled out prior to any work being completed. But if you choose from the palette, you will ensure that you are within the standards of our community.

We are in the process of getting feedback from all homeowners, and hope to have it approved in the coming months. 
Another option is to download the Playstore App, HCSO Tip, which allows you to anonymously report tips, along with pictures, to the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office.

LHO neighborhood tips

Travis Robbins, a community resource officer with the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Department, was the guest speaker at the Lake Heather Oaks monthly board meeting on June 29 at the Northdale Park & Recreation Center. Travis spent more than 30 minutes providing input and answering questions from residents, and was instrumental in a speed-monitoring device being placed recently on Vallely Drive, where speeding has been an issue.

Here are some of his summer tips:

Vehicles - The overwhelming majority of all auto burglaries reported, over 80 percent occur to vehicles left unsecured. An unlocked car makes an easy target for criminals. Once inside, a thief can be in and out of your car within seconds, and with whatever you left inside – cash or a checkbook, electronics, a firearm, your garage door opener or house keys, and in some cases, even your car! You can deter auto burglary by following these few simple recommendations:

- Always lock your car. Roll up all the windows and lock all the doors.

- Never leave your car unattended while the engine is still running (it's a violation of Florida law).

- Never leave items of value inside your car out in plain sight. Remove them from your car or secure them in the trunk.

- Always activate your car alarm.

- Try to park in well lit, highly-visible areas or inside a secured and monitored garage.

Vacations - Don't advertise on Social Media (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, et al) while you're away on vacation. Telling everyone your house will be empty for the next two weeks lets any potential burglars know they've got plenty of time to steal. Whenever possible, have a relative, trusted friend or neighbor "house sit" for you or check on your house periodically to bring in mail, newspapers, etc. while you're gone. Make sure doors and windows are locked and (if equipped) make sure your residential alarm system is set and working properly. Hide or remove any items of value out in plain view. Secure valuables in a safe, safety deposit box, or other secure location. Make sure you can be contacted in the event of an emergency, if needed.

Children - Caution children staying at home alone to keep doors and windows locked, and the alarm set. Teach your kids not to open the door to a stranger and how to call 911 in an emergency. Children should have a family member or trusted adult they can contact if they're scared or if there's an emergency. Daylight lasts longer during the summer, so be sure your kids know what time curfew is and to check in if they're going to be late. Make sure your kids stay hydrated in the summer heat!

Swimming - Make sure young children know to stay away from pools, spas, lakes, ponds, rivers, canals, and any other body of water when there is no adult supervision. Most drowning incidents occur in residential pools when children are left unattended! Use locks or alarms to keep children from getting into pool areas undetected. Always have rescue equipment nearby and telephone 911 in case of an emergency. Save a life and learn CPR!!!

Unlicensed vehicles – Drivers of vehicles such as ATVs, dirt bikes and go-karts that do not possess a license plate and speed on area streets can receive a civil citation and \$102 fine.


